<p data-bbox="62 212 371 280">Year 2 Term 6 Our Wonderful World</p> 	<p data-bbox="421 140 732 584">Our outdoor PE focus this term is Athletics. Here we will learn to use various takeoffs and landings, overarm and underarm throws and we will learn the difference between jogging and running. Our Indoor PE is continuing to learn gymnastic techniques. Our focus will be combining spinning, turning and twisting within a sequence.</p>	<p data-bbox="779 204 1346 552">We will be continuing our world theme in our final topic. We will recap the continents and oceans and discover the equator and the northern and southern hemispheres. From here we will look at how some of the physical features around the world have changed over the last 100 years and learn about the effects of Global Warming. We will make comparisons of the Rainforest and forests in England.</p>	<p data-bbox="1391 169 1809 587">This term's topic covers recognising safe and unsafe situations in unfamiliar environments such as water and fire risk. They will learn to recognise who can help to keep them safe. PSHE will also focus on change and how to manage things that may be out of their control. We will also be discussing transition into a new class year.</p>	<p data-bbox="1854 188 2175 568">We will perform simple patterns and accompaniments keeping a steady pulse. We will sing or clap with increasing or decreasing tempo and play simple rhythmic patterns on an instrument. Finally, we will make connections between notations and musical sounds.</p>

We will learn facts like the number of minutes in an hour and the number of hours in a day. From here we will find different combinations of coins that equal the same amounts of money. Finally, in a practical context, we will learn addition and subtraction of money of the same unit, including giving change.</p>
